# Aims of the changes

**Deliver against our commitment to enable diverse and inclusive discovery research in our responsive mode offer**

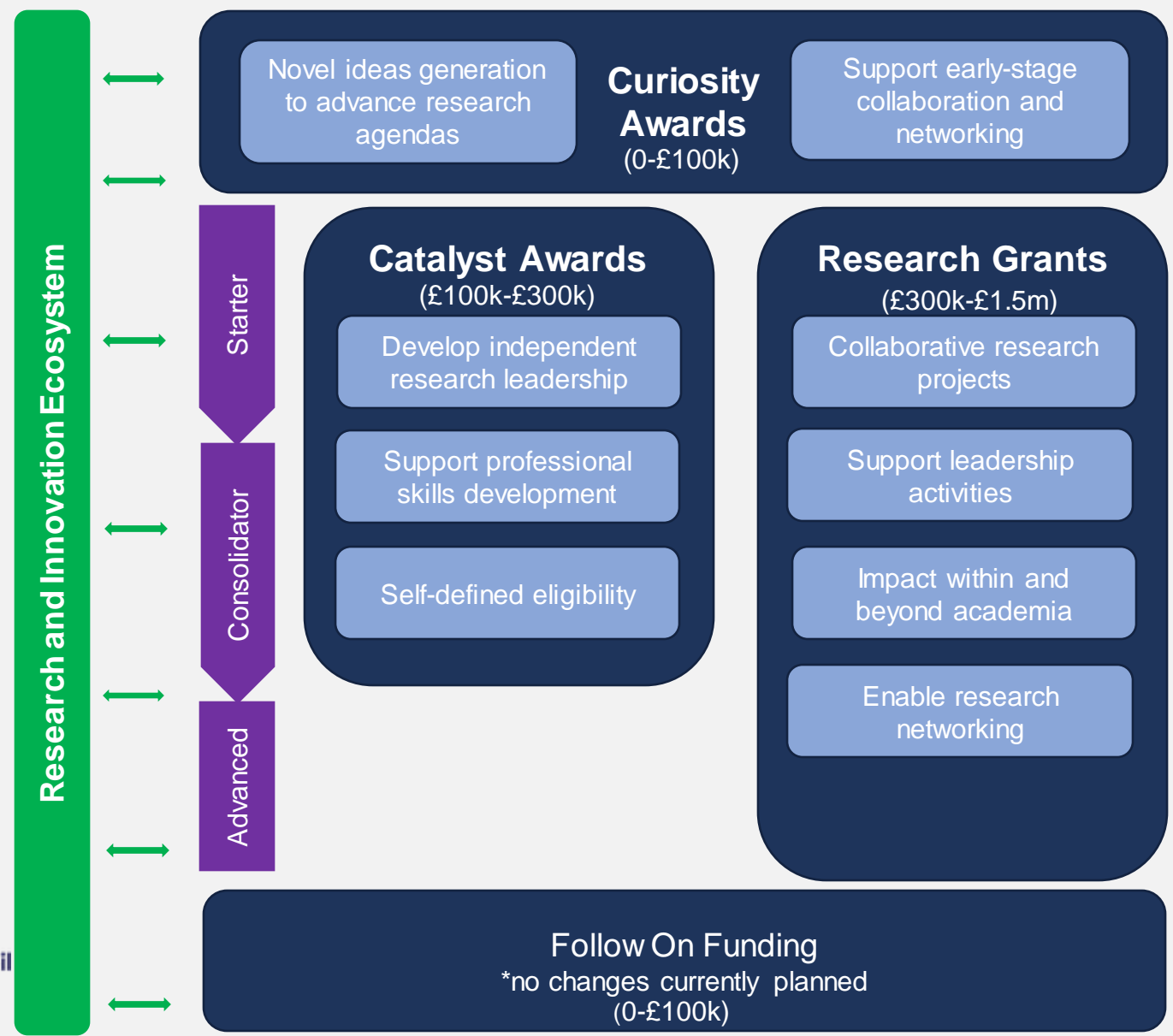
- Increase flexibility and accessibility to support a greater range of researchers and research ideas/projects.
- Improve support for progression through the schemes for both research ideas and researchers, as well as minimising gaps in our offering.
- Support emerging arts and humanities talent, by offering new and expanded provision for start of career and early career researchers as well as increasing access to researchers with non-traditional career paths.
- Offer provision for larger and more ambitious projects, which also acknowledges the increasing cost of research.

Curiosity Awards	Catalyst Awards
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Flexible awards to fund curiosity-driven research, networking activity and idea generation, which enables the <b>development of further research opportunities and new research agendas.</b></li><li>• Funding projects between £1 and £100,000.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Awards to support researchers without prior experience of leading a significant research project, with the aim of <b>accelerating their trajectory as independent researchers and build leadership experience.</b></li><li>• Funding projects between £100,000 and £300,000.</li></ul>

# Applications in the Funding Service

## APPLICATION:

- Opportunities across all councils found in one place
- Guidance and questions are consistent, concise, in one place and include assessment criteria
- RO visibility as soon as applications created
- Only ask for what we need once, when we need it. Far fewer attachments.
- Accessible and intuitive interface
- Automated checks before submission e.g. word count (reducing return for amendment)

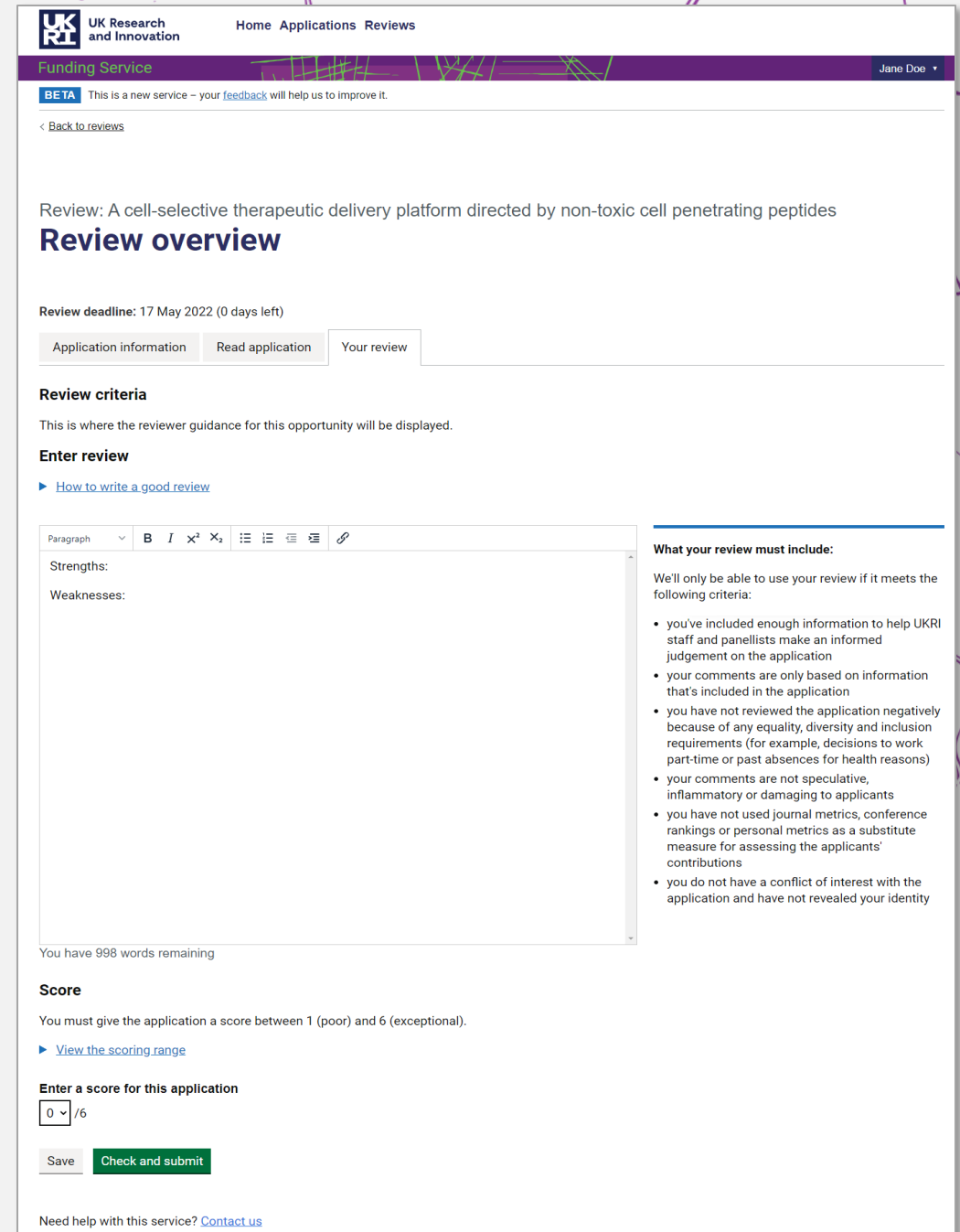

- AHRC will be launching responsive mode opportunities as consecutive rounds with defined closing dates, using [UKRI core assessment criteria and questions](#).
- This will accommodate system and policy developments whilst ensuring that batches of applications receive equitable treatment.
- It is our intention to return to 'always open' responsive mode when this is made possible within the Funding Service.
- UKRI's [principles of assessment and decision making](#) remain unchanged.
