




Pump Priming Fund Committee





Pump Priming Fund aims

- Cambridge Knowledge Exchange Network (KEN) colleagues are invited to apply for up to £20k of 'pump priming' funding for challenge-led activities, to support collaborative research between the University and industry.
- Individual projects within the £20k overall budget are suggested not to exceed £5k. The scheme does not fund posts.
- Pump Priming Fund is not intended to fund individual research projects.
- Subject to funding availability, the funding scheme is open for application each term.

Application process


Applications submitted by KEN colleagues as the lead applicant(s) and developed jointly with the industry partners. Applications via the Qualtrics application form:

Key dates



Evaluation criteria

- Strength of the proposal in terms of promoting interdisciplinary research or enabling new collaborations.
- Relevance to the strategic aims of the applicants' knowledge transfer goals.
- Importance and impact of the expected outcomes/outputs.

Applications will be assessed to ensure

Balanced portfolio

Value for money (e.g. leveraged/matched funding)

New partnerships (e.g. enabling new collaborations)

Added value over and above existing partnership

Applications are particularly encouraged where

More than one School is involved

Creative use of the money is demonstrated

Innovative approaches to industry collaboration are shown



Terms and conditions

- Max funding is £20k.
- Provide a 6-month progress report.
- Provide final report.
- Complete activities in 12 months.



Example proposals

Up to four collaborative projects leading from an interdisciplinary workshop (with the workshop already funded)

Costs of a challenge-led workshop and collaborative projects

Testing of new models of working between KEN and business

Please note that this is not a prescriptive list. Applicants are invited to use this opportunity to think creatively and to innovate but it is essential that you work in partnership with external organisations to design and deliver the project(s).
